Task Force Charge

The Task Force was charged with ensuring that an open process was followed in choosing a common name for the four entities (Early Childhood Education Center, A.W. Spalding Elementary, Collegedale Adventist Middle School, and Collegedale Academy) that fall under the Greater Collegedale School System (GCSS).

Overview of the Task Force Process

We began with a series of meetings intended to inform ourselves about the current structure and processes within the GCSS.

We gathered input from a variety of sources. The most extensive of these were from listening events with the ECEC-12 faculty/staff members and two community focus group meetings. These efforts culminated with a Town Hall forum open to the community. During these listening sessions, we focused on collecting feedback and understanding comments, suggestions, and questions.

These meetings produced a considerable amount of feedback and led to evolving thoughts and deliberations within the Task Force. This report is reflective of the input received and summarizes the findings and recommendations.

Task Force Key Finding

Based on the feedback from the various listening sessions, it was determined that the overall consensus is positive toward unifying under one name.

History of the Greater Collegedale School System

The GCSS has a rich history with many changes, but always with the constant focus upon providing a strong Seventh-day Adventist Education to generations of children that pass through this valley.

In looking back at the 1968 Constitution, the initial goal was to unify our schools. The following passage is taken from the 1968 Constitution: ***“The progressive trend in education today is toward consolidation of school units in order to enrich the curricula and provide the best possible teaching personnel and facilities at a minimum cost...Although to begin with, the identities of these two units shall be retained, the structure shall be adequate to encompass the enlargement to a 6-3-3 school system when and if the need and desire arises.”*** (Appendix #6)



- One School Accreditation
- One Finance Office/Audit/Tax ID
- One Development Department
- One Marketing/Recruitment Office
- One Plant Services Department
- One IT Department


The Struggle with Our Fragmented Identity

These are some of the powerful stories that surfaced as a result of talking with stakeholders. The intention is to illustrate the types of issues that could be resolved by unifying the name.

COMMUNITY SERVICE/OUTREACH - Our students volunteer in the community in numerous ways and one example is a preschool through 12th grade effort in collecting cans for CAD4HOPE in partnership with the Samaritan Center. I had the privilege to drive the Collegedale Academy students around as they dropped off bags and picked up cans in our community. One gentlemen that we encountered said, *“I knew it was you, Collegedale Academy! I saw you coming with your bags and recognized you right away. We look forward to seeing you and supporting this important cause each year.”*



Currently, each campus facilitates community service outreach (including CAD4HOPE) under their individual identity. It got me thinking...*how much greater of an impact could our students make in witnessing under one name potentially tripling the recognition of who we represent.* –Parent Volunteer



UNIFIED IDENTITY TO COMMUNITY - Recently the GCSS celebrated National Pi Day by hosting a STEM night in the academy gym for grades 6 through 12. Attached is an article that was written for the paper to highlight this event to the community. What struck me is how many names/student references are listed in the article. *Do people even know who the GCSS is? Did CAMS get proper recognition? Could the broader community identify us as one school body? How much more of an impact could we have by identifying ourselves as one name?* –Parent/Employee

ACADEMIC - Recently, a perspective international student was applying to study at Collegedale Academy. For their I-20 paperwork submission, they needed the school to write a letter indicating their acceptance. The school issued a letter on CA's letterhead. Unfortunately, the U.S. Embassy denied the student's application because of the discrepancy between the business name (GCSS) and the school name (CA). There was no recourse or appeal and the individual was unable to attend our school. *The school not only lost tuition, but also a witnessing opportunity.* –CA Administration

BUSINESS EASE - Barbara Hunt (CAMS Principal) went to the Village Market to purchase some items for CAMS. The seasoned check-out clerk needed to look up the name that the school account was under for tax exempt purposes. Barbara presented her CAMS ID badge and a Collegedale Academy credit card but the account was not found. Finally, the clerk found the Greater Collegedale School System account after several frustrating minutes. *This confusion is present WITHIN our local Adventist community, and is even more accentuated the further we move from Collegedale.*

BUSINESS EASE - Selena Trott (7th Grade CAMS Teacher) went to the School Box to pick up supplies for her class. A considerable amount of time was spent with the clerk to find under which name the account was registered. The clerk first searched Collegedale Adventist Middle School, as presented on Selena's ID card. When an account was not found, the clerk then searched for A.W. Spalding Elementary, Collegedale Academy, and the Greater Collegedale School System. *This experience was both cumbersome and time consuming for all parties involved.*

PRACTICAL PARENTAL ISSUE (UNIFORMS) - My child did not grow much during the transition years between AWS and CAMS. She could have continued to wear the same uniform shirt but currently our uniforms have different logos (AWS/CAMS/CA). Therefore, I needed to purchase new uniform shirts for my daughter although the old shirts were not worn out. *Consolidating can have a huge cost advantage for parents.* –Family of three GCSS students

The Power of One: What are the Specific Benefits?

Parents/Students

- Streamline and economize uniform purchases
- Reduce confusion when describing where each child attends school
- Simplify communication from the school
- Strengthen school spirit
- Provide common school spirit wear

Employees

- Increase camaraderie among campuses
- Simplify business transactions
- Increase curriculum collaboration among teachers

- Give clarity in identification
- Triple the occurrences a singular name is used
- Simplify our marketing and recruiting

Conclusion

Based on our findings, the Task Force recommends a consolidation of the business and brand to: *Collegedale Academy*.

Why Collegedale Academy?

- Value placed on the historical significance of the name Collegedale Academy. CA is well known in our greater community and across the nation
- Maintain a sense of identity for alumni and former faculty
- Consolidation to an existing name would be a smoother and less expensive transition

In order to accomplish the consolidation of business and brand to Collegedale Academy, the Task Force also recommends the following steps be taken:

For Immediate Implementation

- Change the business name from Greater Collegedale School System to Collegedale Academy
- Change the signage at AWS & CAMS to reflect the consolidated name
- Identify the preschool-5 building as Collegedale Academy -Elementary-
- Identify the 6-8 building as Collegedale Academy -Middle-
- Change uniform logos to C.A. and grandfather in AWS/CAMS uniforms for 3 school years
- Replace business materials as required
- Honor the legacy of Arthur Whitefield Spalding in a meaningful way (such as naming an area of academic importance, offering elementary scholarships, etc.)

For Implementation Over the Next Three Years

- Unify a communication platform to parents
- Increase cross-campus collaboration
- Adopt a preschool-12 Student Information System (Ren-Web/PowerSchool)
- Set-up student mentorship programs between grade levels
- Examine school colors
- Identify a school mascot
- Establish a common email/network/etc.
- Explore options for a singular, answering phone system

Appendix #2: Questions and Answers

Answers to questions raised that were not directly answered in the report.

1) Is an academy only “high school”?

- A. The use of “academy” to define a place of study within the Seventh-day Adventist church does not hold to specific grades. The Task Force found 50 Adventist academies within the United States that operate as singular Preschool/PreK/K through 12 learning environments. This includes South Lancaster Academy; the oldest operating Adventist grade school in North America. Consolidating to Collegedale Academy would not be in conflict with the academy model set forth across the country. (Appendix #7)

2) Why did the school’s marketing come up in the accreditation?

- A. School viability has historically been a key component to evaluating a school’s program. During an accreditation, the evaluating team not only looks at the academic components the school offers, but the entire mechanism of operation. This includes the evaluation of the Spiritual program, financing, marketing, campus safety, IT, community perception, etc. Specifically, the team wants to see how successful the school is at communicating who they are and what they offer to the local and broader community. The Columbia and Southern Unions have led in recent years in this endeavor. They evaluate complete programs as Adventist education and it is not just about academics but about educating the mind, body, and soul.

3) What would happen to the CA seal? Who can use it?

- A. The Task Force is not able to discern what would happen with the academy seal. If the name Collegedale Academy remains however, the seal would not change or go away. It is understood there is great meaning behind each of the symbols and it would be expected that administration would ensure this is not lost nor the seal misused.

4) Do we understand how extensive a legal name change would be?

- A. Research indicates that changing the name from GCSS to CA will require filing numerous forms and documents with appropriate federal, state and local organizations, and little, if any, cost. The organization will need to change the registered name of the FEIN (federal ID number), the TN state sales tax exemption certificate, the AASI accounting system and SURF (Southern Union Revolving Fund). Minutes from the Constituency Meeting, an updated Constitution and letters from Officers of the organization should suffice to make these changes.

GCSS bank partners will already need new paperwork as a result of changes to the GCSS administration (AWS Principal retirement), and a change of names on these accounts will be accomplished with those new resolutions and bank signatory cards. Many local vendors already use the name Collegedale Academy, and those that use one of the other names (AWS, CAMS, GCSS) will be informed as appropriate.

The annual financial audit confirms the interconnection of the three campuses, noting that the GCSS is comprised of the ECEC, AWS, CAMS and CA as one entity. Not having multiple DBA (doing business as) names for the GCSS and utilizing Collegedale Academy should provide continuity for our regulatory and local partners.

5) Why are alumni and non-constituent parents unable to vote?

- A. The GCSS constitution states that only members of constituent churches may vote. GCSS constituent churches include Collegedale Community Church, Collegedale SDA Church, Hamilton Community Church, Hispanic Community SDA Church, McDonald Road SDA Church, and the Su Casa Spanish-American SDA Church.

6) How do we identify the buildings?

- A. The Task Force recommends the preschool-5 (currently AWS) building be labeled as Collegedale Academy -Elementary- and the 6-8 building (currently CAMS) be labeled as Collegedale Academy -Middle-. By doing so, the separate campuses would remain identified without diluting the entity name, Collegedale Academy.

7) Why are we given one name to review?

- A. The policy committee charged the Task Force to choose “a common name”. This was voted on and approved by the school board on February 5, 2019.

8) How will we answer the phones?

- A. It would be proper for the school phones to be answered using the name on the building/campus. One suggestion brought to the Task Force’s attention multiple times was to have a common phone number as well. This concept is out of the Task Force purview, and is recommending the school administration examine this concept further.

9) What would be the financial cost of the transition?

- A. The main cost for this transition would be for the signage and our initial quote is between \$11,000 - \$13,000. Not factored into this price is the stucco repair and paint for those areas. We are unable to know the cost for the repair work until the old signage is removed but it is not expected to be of great sum.

The second expected cost will be the replacement of business materials. The Task Force recommends these be replaced as required and a repurposing of any materials that may need to be replaced prior to them being used. It should be noted these materials have been purchased on an “as used basis” therefore, there is NOT a large stockpile of materials.

This money for the signage update would be applied from each respective reserve fund. The funds for new office materials would come from already established budgets.

10) What is the impact on other local schools if we consolidate to *Collegedale Academy*?

- A. The Task Force does not see a direct impact on neighboring Adventist schools. Recruiting efforts at these schools will continue to target the incoming 9th grade students. CA would still be the nearest option for secondary Adventist education with Georgia-Cumberland Academy being the nearest Adventist boarding school. Just as other schools are looking to strengthen their program, the goal of the board and administration is to strengthen the GCSS for the present and the future.

11) If the schools combine, how will budgets be handled (Combined vs. Separate)?

- A. The consolidation of the school name will not affect the budget structure. A few items to note on the existing GCSS budget: 1) The budget for the 2019/2020 school year has already been approved. There will not be a tuition raise to cover the cost of consolidation. 2) Our financial identity is already considered as one (since 1968) and we have one audit every year. Currently, AWS, CAMS, and CA are budgeted on an individual basis and this will continue to be the standard under a consolidated name.

12) Would a consolidation reduce the quality of the academy?

- A. Our board, administration, and faculty/staff are committed to our mission statement.

13) Is there a legal requirement for consolidation?

- A. No

Appendix #6: 1968 Constitution

BY-LAWS AND WORKING POLICY
OF THE
GREATER COLLEGEDALE SCHOOLS
(A. W. SPALDING ELEMENTARY AND COLLEGEDALE ACADEMY)

I. PREAMBLE

Whereas-

The progressive trend in education today is toward consolidation of school units in order to enrich curriculae and provide the best possible teaching personnel and facilities at a minimum cost, and

Whereas-

We have been admonished by the prophet of the Lord to make our educational program "the head and not the tail" to provide workers of whom we need not be ashamed, and

Whereas-

We have at Collegedale a center ideally adapted to a consolidated school to serve the churches within a reasonable radius,

We hereby, set forth the By-Laws and Working Policy of the Greater Collegedale Schools to serve the youth of this area from Grades 1 through 12 to the extent that the Churches within reasonable commuting distance shall individually choose.

II. EDUCATIONAL PLAN

The Collegedale Seventh-day Adventist Church hereby enters into a cooperative plan for the establishment, control, and operation of a Grade 1-12 school system adjacent to the campus of Southern Missionary College which shall initially comprise the present Arthur W. Spalding School and the Collegedale Academy. Although to begin with, the indentities of these two units shall be retained, the structure shall be adequate to encompass the enlargement to a 6-3-3 school system when and if the need and desire arises.
